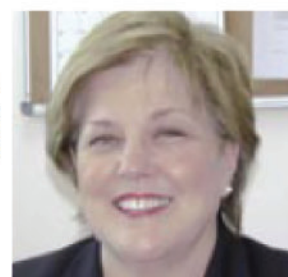

Overview of the Foundation Program Department of English (FPDE)

In Fall 2003, The Foundation Unit Committee was established to develop a common Foundation Department that would serve to prepare students for entry into the Colleges of Business and Economics, Engineering and Science at Qatar University. In Fall 2004, The Foundation Program was implemented to provide necessary academic skills in English, Math and Computer.

As part of the Foundation Program, the Department of English (FPDE) had 696 students. Structurally, the FPDE consisted of the Head of Department, Mrs. Amna bint Saud Al-Thani, and two Coordinators for Curriculum and Administration. Dr. Medani Othman was appointed Head of Department in 2005, followed by Mr. Robert Kennedy in 2006.

Over the years, the management structure of the FPDE expanded and changed to meet the needs of the growing student population. In fall 2009, the Program opened 93 sections accommodating approximately 2000 students. Presently, the organizational structure of the Program includes five committees covering Administration & Facilities, Curriculum, Testing & Assessment, Student Services, and Faculty Development & Accreditation. In addition, the scope of colleges for which the Program now serves includes most colleges on campus.

The Program offers two semesters (Fall & Spring) of pre-credit English for Academic Purposes (EAP) courses with 4 levels of instruction. The aim of the program is to develop students' level of English and academic skills so that they will be able to function efficiently in English medium classes at Qatar University.

In addition to EAP courses, the Program also offers a number of student services. Over the years, Foundation English Student Services ran various support centres and activities such as the Foundation Student Learning Support Centre (SLSC), peer tutoring, IELTS and TOEFL examination preparation, clubs, competitions, debates, movie lab and field trips.

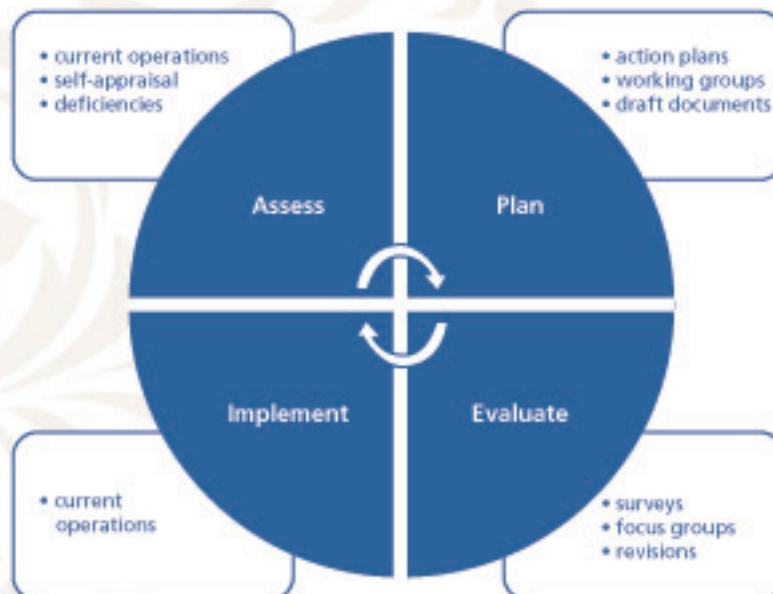

Process of Accreditation

The accreditation process began with an application for eligibility and an initial self-study plan in spring 2006. In September 2006, the Program hosted a 3-day CEA orientation workshop led by Teresa O'Donnell, CEA Executive Director and Mary Reeves, CEA Former Commissioner to instruct committee members in conducting and reporting on a comprehensive self-study of the Program. An Accreditation Booklet was published to inform faculty of CEA accreditation.

In the initial stages of the self-study process, committee members gathered information about the Program's facilities, student services, and administration through extensive interviews with QU housing and admissions, and Foundation English faculty and students. From 2007 to 2009, the Program worked towards completing a Self-Study Report. The Program's Accreditation Coordinator and committee members responded to 52 CEA standards. As the committee addressed each standard, they embarked on a self-assessment which described and evaluated current practices. Current practices were measured against the standards and, where appropriate, improved to ensure compliance. This process of self-study was cyclical and initiated a road map for program development whereby input from all stakeholders provided the basis for positive change. See chart below.



The Accreditation Coordinator, Justin Richards, worked closely with the Foundation Program Director, Dr. Khalid Al-Ali, the Head of English Department, Robert Kennedy, and other Program Coordinators to review and revise policies. Changes in the program's policies and administration have also been reviewed by the Academic Board and other decision-making bodies within the University. In November 2008, Teresa O'Donnell, CEA Executive Director, visited the Program once again to inform faculty and guide committee members in completing the Self-Study Report. The Site Visit

Upon submission of the Self-Study Report, the Program underwent a site visit review in November 2009. Over 4 days, the site-review team, Teresa O'Donnell, Executive Director and review team members Rebecca Smith-Murdock and Susan Marie Rumann met the Foundation Program Director, Coordinators, faculty and students, and held classroom visits and interviews to determine whether the CEA standards had been met, and to assess the level of preparedness of the Program for accreditation. In April 2010, a 13-member CEA Commission used the Self-Study Report, the Review Team Report and a review of finances to make its accreditation decision.

Highlights of the Accreditation Letter

Dear Mr. Kennedy

At its April 2010 meeting, the Commission on English Language Program Accreditation reviewed the application for accreditation of the Foundation Program English Department (FPED) at Qatar University. I am pleased to inform you that the Commission has granted initial accreditation to the program for a period of 5 years. The enclosed Certificate of Accreditation signifies the program's achievement in meeting the CEA Standards for English Language Programs and Institutions.

In reviewing a program or institution for accreditation, the Commission seeks to determine that the mission and educational objectives are being communicated and met; that the program or institution is organized so that its mission and educational objectives are supported by adequate human and fiscal resources; and that there is evidence of sufficient financial stability for the site to carry out its educational objectives. The Commission has determined that your program meets these requirements and commends the program for its achievement.

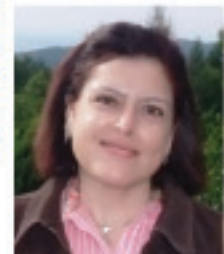
Ms. Stephanie Pinnacle, Faculty Development & Accreditation Coordinator: "As a CEA-Accredited Program, we are now members of the CEA Constituent Council. And as members, we agree to maintain CEA standards and adhere to CEA policies and procedures. Each year, we must submit an annual report showing that CEA standards continue to be met and provide CEA with current marketing materials and an end-of-year financial report.

The re-accreditation process will begin in 2013. Once again, the Program will complete a Self-Study Report and welcome a re-accreditation site visit team in 2014.

According to CEA criteria, re-accreditation may be given for one year for programs and institutions that substantially meet CEA standards, or 10 years for programs and institutions that fully comply with the standards. Our goal is to continue to excel in program development and improve policies & procedures in accordance with CEA standards".

Foundation Program Department of Math & Computer Achievements

Dr. Maha Nabhan, Head of Department Foundation Math & Computer: "Being part of Qatar University for the last eight years and witnessing in fall 2004 the establishment of the Foundation Program in line with Qatar University Reform, I can assure readers that Qatar University is leading the way in providing excellent teaching and services. The Foundation Program administration, faculty and students are very pleased and proud that the English Program has been CEA accredited for 5 years.



The excellence, of the now officially accredited English Program, is paralleled in the outstanding accomplishments of the Math & Computer Program. Presented here are some highlights of the special Achievements of the Department of Math & Computer, Foundation Program:

Leader in Using Blackboard as a Course Management System at Qatar University

Since the introduction of the Learning Management System Blackboard at QU, the department took the lead in using this system in all courses. To achieve that, the department offered intensive in-house training in Blackboard during its Professional Development Days and a weekly open lab throughout spring 2007 semester. By fall 2007, the use of blackboard for all department courses became mandatory – two years ahead of other QU departments.

Provider of experts in Blackboard & ICDL training to Qatar University Community

Several department members, in particular, the Computer Program Coordinator Dr. M. Arslan Ayari, took the lead in providing a campus-wide training in beginning, intermediate and advanced levels of Blackboard. This training took place during the academic years 2008/2009 and 2009/2010 under the auspices of OFID.

Also, the department took the initiative in the establishment of Qatar University ICDL center which is now run under the supervision of Qatar University Continuing Education Office. Mr. Ali Izzat, the center manger & Mr. Osman Albashir, the center exam coordinator are both members of Department of Math and Computer. In addition, many department faculty members pioneered in teaching ICDL courses since the establishment of the center.

Innovator - Migration from Excel spreadsheet to an online class and record keeping management system

Starting Fall 2009, the department introduced the new online grade and attendance management system dubbed "E-monitoring System" developed by Mr Fethi Ferjani. The system serves as an electronic tool to record all students' data and to provide instant access online to all groups' attendance and grades record for the department administration.

Networker: CISCO Academic Courses

Beginning summer 2008 a group of computer instructors in the Department of Math and Computer successfully passed the theoretical and practical parts of the Information Technology Essentials CISCO courses. The skills, knowledge, and in-depth theoretical and practical know-how acquired by the participants will reflect in computer courses offered and ultimately to all Foundation students. The Foundation program is now officially nominated by CISCO as Local Cisco Academy."

Qatar University Colleges & Programs Accreditation

Ongoing developments at the institution are the successes by several colleges, programs and centres in gaining international accreditation. Achieving international accreditation is one of the priority areas of QU's Reform Plan towards institutional excellence and quality.

The institution's research centers -- the Environmental Studies Center (ESC), Materials Technology Unit (MTU) and Central Laboratory Unit (CLU) were recently awarded ISO 17025 accreditation. In December last year, the College of Business and Economics celebrated its accreditation award from the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB). The successes follow those in 2009 of the College of Pharmacy and the Chemistry Program; in 2008 the Biomedical Program, and in 2006, 4 programs of the College of Engineering. Most other QU colleges and programs are in the process of achieving similar international accreditation status.
