# Joint International Conference on Public Diplomacy in the Arab Gulf States: Policies and Practices in collaboration with Katara Public Diplomacy Center



In cooperation with the Katara Public Diplomacy Center, the Gulf Studies Center hosted two-day "Public Diplomacy а Conference in the Arab Gulf States" at February 19-20, 2023. The Katara on conference was attended by numerous ambassadors. heads of diplomatic missions. academics. researchers. and experts in the field of public diplomacy.

The event began with a welcoming speech by H.E. Prof. Khalid bin Ibrahim Al Sulaiti, General Manager of Katara Village Foundation, followed by opening remarks from Dr. Omar Al Ansari, Vice President for Academic **Affairs** of Qatar University. Participants from 12 countries around the world presented 30 papers, discussing the role of public diplomacy in the Gulf states. The event was inaugurated by Prof. Mahjoob Zweiri, and featured keynote speeches by Prof. Nicholas Cull and Dr. Rhonda Zaharna.

On the second day of the event, H.E. Dr. Majed Mohammad Hassan Abdullah Al-Ansari, Spokesperson of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the State of Qatar, delivered a keynote speech moderated by Prof. Saban Kardas.

The outcome of the event will be a book containing the papers, which will be published in due course.

# **Ambassadorial Visit Series**



As an interdisciplinary graduate program and research center, Gulf Studies aims to collaborate with a variety of institutions and sectors to expand students' knowledge, diversify their resources, and unlock new opportunities for them. One of the most influential and prominent collaborations is with different embassies in Qatar.

Since January 2023, which marked the start of the spring semester, the Gulf Studies Center has hosted four Ambassadors to deliver speeches to the Gulf Studies Center community.

On February 5, 2023, the Gulf Studies Center hosted H.E. Dr. Cristian Tudor, the Ambassador of the European Union to The State of Qatar, to discuss "EU- Qatar relations in a post-World Cup Gulf region"

H.E. Mr. Timmy Davis, Ambassador of the United States of America to the State of Qatar, was invited on February 12, 2023, to discuss "America's Future Role in the Region." On March 19, 2023, the Gulf Studies Center hosted the Ambassador of the Republic of Argentina to the State of Qatar. H.E. Guillermo Nicolas. delivered a talk on "Argentina, Qatar, and the GCC: Bilateral and Regional Relations." On May 7, the center hosted H.E. Dr. Fishbach. Claudius Ambassador Germany to the State of Qatar, to discuss "German-Qatari Relations: Current Topics, Future Perspectives."

# Russia's War in Ukraine and the Geopolitics of the GCC Hydrocarbons

On June 4, 2023, the Gulf Studies Center hosted a talk presented by Dr. Nikolay Kozhanov, Associate Research Professor at the center, titled "Russia's War in Ukraine and the Geopolitics of GCC Hydrocarbons." Dr. Kozhanov discussed the transformation of hydrocarbon markets in light of the Russia-Ukraine conflict, highlighting the challenges faced by Gulf oil and gas producers. The lecture explored how the ongoing war in Ukraine shapes the development of the GCC oil and gas sectors, as well as their strategies for hydrocarbon exports.

# Issues of Higher Education in the Middle East: Cases of Qatar and Iran.

In collaboration with the Chair of the State of Qatar for Islamic Area Studies at Waseda University, the Gulf Studies Center hosted a workshop titled "Issues of Higher Education in the Middle East: Cases of Qatar and Iran" on February 8, 2023. The workshop commenced with opening remarks by Prof. Mahjoob Zweiri, Director of the Gulf Studies Center at Qatar University, and Dr. Abdullah Baabood, Chair of the State of Qatar for Islamic Area Studies at Waseda University, Japan.

By addressing different important topics, the workshop aimed to shed light on the unique aspects of higher education in Qatar and Iran. The discussions provided valuable insights into the coexistence of tradition and modernity, the experiences of women faculty members, and the impact of higher education expansion.

# The Gulf and the European Union: Navigating Shifting Sands




# Restoring Diplomatic Relations Declaration between Saudi Arabia and Iran: Motivations and the Implications for the Gulf and wider Middle East.


