The Architectural Advisory Board is a group of professionals working in local industry who meet every year to advise the department on curricular, professional, and research issues from the perspective of a working professional and market dynamics. The Advisory Board supports and facilitates the department in fulfilling its mission. Members from professional, government, and business communities are appointed for a three-year term. An Advisory Board member may serve up to two 3- year terms for a maximum of 6 years. The Advisory Board ensures that the programs continue to meet the needs of the profession.
