The Gulf Studies Center (GSC), at the College of Arts and Sciences at Qatar University, in collaboration with the Doha International Family Institute (DIFI), hosted its eighth annual conference on November 19th-20th, 2023, in Doha. This year’s annual conference was devoted to a specific theme on “The Family in the Gulf: Continuity and Change.” The two-day international interdisciplinary conference brought together several international and local scholars and experts focusing on the social and cultural transformations taking place in the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) member states, in particular focusing on the rapid change in the institution of family. Throughout the conference, the participants were involved in broad discussions, exploring the factors, directions, and magnitudes of change in the Gulf families from an interdisciplinary

perspective. In total, eight panels were crafted to delve into pivotal themes related to family concept, such as gender, youth, aging, technology, arts, sports, migration, and family policies of the GCC states.

“Understanding Electoral Politics and State-Society Relations in the Gulf, Middle East and North Africa”



The Gulf Studies Center at the College of Arts and Sciences successfully convened a collaborative workshop on November 26, 2023, in partnership with SEPAD and OPEMAM. The event, titled "Understanding Electoral Politics and the State-Society Relations in the Gulf, Middle East, and North Africa," marked the second round of this insightful initiative.

Held in person at Qatar University, the workshop brought together a dynamic assembly of 17 experts, each contributing valuable insights through 10 research papers. The diverse range of topics covered included electoral politics, party systems, sectarianism, political participation, elections, electoral law, the intersection of elections and international relations, and ethnic divisions.

As the discussions unfolded, participants engaged in enriching dialogues, fostering a deeper understanding of the intricate

dynamics shaping the political landscape of the region.

The exchange of ideas and perspectives among the experts not only contributed to the academic discourse but also strengthened the collaborative spirit driving research in the field.

The success of this workshop underscores the importance of fostering academic partnerships and collaborative efforts in unraveling the complexities of electoral politics and state-society relations in our diverse and dynamic region.

The organizers of the joint workshop, Dr. Luciano Zaccara, Prof. Simon Mabon, Prof. Rafael Bustos and Dr. Edward Wastnidge, agreed in the success of the event and the high quality of the papers presented, and they committed to continue with the following steps of the project, that include the publication of the selected papers in a special issue at a reputed peer reviewed journal.

Joint Workshops

The Gulf and Europe in Multipolar World



The workshop, titled 'The Gulf and Europe in a Multipolar World,' was organized collaboratively by the Gulf Studies Center and the Konrad Adenauer Foundation, Regional Program Gulf States on December 12, 2023. The event featured the presence of German Member of Parliament, Thomas Röwekamp. His address delved into the intricate links and cooperation between Germany and Europe, particularly in the realms of defense and security, with the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) states. . His remarks were introduced by Prof. Mahjoob Zweiri, Director of the GSC and Dr. Canan Atilgan, Head of the Middle East and North Africa Department at KAS, and moderated by Philipp Burkhardt from KAS.

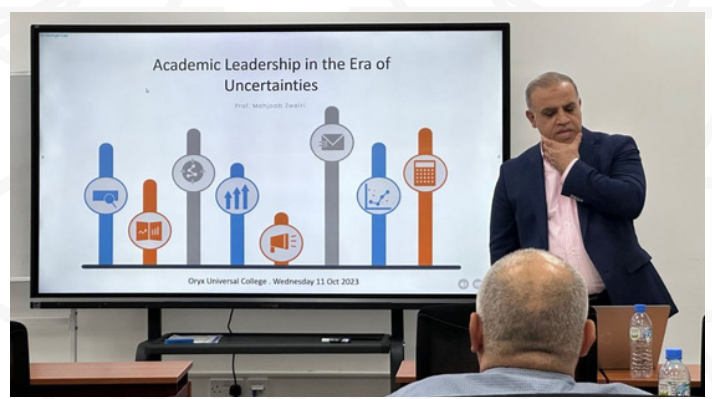
His remarks were commented by a group of Qatar based scholars, Prof. Gerd Nonneman, Prof. Saban Kardas, Dr. Nikolay Kozhanov and Dr. Luciano Zaccara, followed by the an open debate with GSC faculty and students. The debate also addressed other aspects of EU-GCC relations as well as the general EU approach to the current regional events, such as the ongoing war in Gaza.

Interests of GCC Hydrocarbon Procedures in the New Realities of the 4th Energy Transition



The Gulf Studies Center hosted a lecture by Dr. Nikolay Kozhanov titled "Interests of GCC Hydrocarbon Producers in the New Realities of the 4th Energy Transition" on December 13, 2023. During his lecture Dr. Nikolay discussed how the international perception of the 4th energy transition priorities changed under the influence of oil and gas market shocks caused by the war in Ukraine. He assessed new challenges that were created by these changes for GCC oil and gas producers and examined the potential effectiveness of responses offered by the oil and gas industries of the Arab Gulf states to the above mentioned threats.

Dr. Khalid Al-Jufairi is the Co-founder and Chairman of the American Center for Strategic and International Affairs (ACSI), a 501c3 think-do tank based in New York City. Dr. Al-Jufairi is an Adjunct Professor at Qatar University's Department of International Affairs, teaching specialized courses on US foreign policy, international politics and culture. He is a visiting lecturer at Georgetown University's Emergency & Disaster Management program.

As a leading thinker and expert in the field, Dr. Al-Jufairi has recently published his book, *The Centrality of Middle Class: Sociopolitical Resilience & Economic Stability* (2022), with Hamad Bin Khalifa University Press. His work appeals to scholars across the social sciences with interest in political stability, ideological states and development narratives.



The rise of the middle class as a thriving social grouping in its societal socioeconomic structure is owed to participatory values and in-country civic policies, and not in a political vacuum.

As an academic, he specialized in GCC-Iran relations. Mirdef Alqashouti participated in many global and regional conferences. He has a BA in Political Sciences from Tehran University, an MA in International Relations from Khazar University, an EMBA from HEC-Paris. A PhD candidate at Durham University, Mirdef Alqashouti speaks English and Farsi fluently. Perspectives on the Gulf Within the Broader MENA



On November 28, 2023, the Gulf Studies Center organized a talk as part of its “Coffee with Scholars” series hosting Dr. Abderahman Salaheldin and Mr. Mithat Rende. The title of the talk was “Perspectives on the Gulf Within the Broader MENA” where our guests and students had a lively discussion covering a

wide range of topics of the Gulf and the wider MENA region. On the topic of the current war on Gaza, Dr. Salaheldin commented “A comprehensive peace proposal is essential to address the longstanding issues in the region, offering a practical path forward for both Israelis and Palestinians. Combining an international force and diplomatic initiatives can pave the way for a secure and stable future for Gaza and the broader region, with additional solutions such as expanding the Gaza Strip and establishing connections with the West Bank.” Mr. Rende explained that “the State of Qatar has played a significant role in mediation in the Middle East and beyond. A case in point is the recent truce brokered between Israel and Hamas in cooperation with Egypt and the United States.” Moreover, Mr. Rende added “Security and lasting peace cannot be achieved by use of force. Political will, dialogue and negotiations in good faith is essential to achieving a just, durable and comprehensive settlement.”

Dr. Abderahman Salaheldin, a retired Ambassador and a member of the Egyptian Council for Foreign Affairs, brings over four decades of diplomatic experience. He lectures regularly at the Egyptian Foreign Ministry’s diplomatic institute on Arab, Turkish and American affairs, actively engages in academic seminars globally, contributes opinion articles and participates in panels evaluating dissertations on US-Arab relations and Turkish foreign affairs. Mithat Rende, former Turkish Ambassador to the OECD and former Chairman of the OECD Executive Committee, boasts a rich diplomatic background. Formerly the Director General for Multilateral Economic Affairs at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, he undertook pivotal roles such as Turkey's Chief Climate Change Negotiator and Chairman of the Trade and Transit Group of the Energy Charter. Ambassador Rende also served as Turkey's Ambassador to Doha-Qatar between 2007-2009 and held various positions in Turkey's missions to NATO, the OSCE, and Embassies in Damascus, Rome, Sofia, and London.

She holds a doctorate in Gulf Studies from Qatar University, a master's degree in Arabic Language and Literature from Sultan Qaboos University, and a bachelor's degree in Journalism and Media from Sultan Qaboos University. She holds several research fellowships at Stanford and Syracuse Universities in the US, and at the National Endowment for Democracy. She completed the program in Public Discourse: Leadership, Narrative, and Action from the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University in 2022.

She has more than thirty years of journalistic experience. She is a former candidate for the Omani Shura Council, and currently speaks on topics related to press freedom and women's empowerment in the Gulf. She was also one of the speakers at the first Arabic language TED Summit held in Doha in March 2023. Her research papers have been widely published and she has contributed chapters in peer-reviewed books, the most recent of which was published in March 2023 in the The Palgrave Handbook of Gender, Media, and Communication in the Middle East and North Africa.
